FAMILY LITERACY ENGLISH FOR SPEAKERS OF OTHER LANGUAGES (ESOL)

The Family Literacy ESOL program is for non-native English-speaking parents who want to help with their child's education by learning language skills for life and work. To participate in this program, parents must have a child 0–16 years old who is enrolled in either Baltimore County Public Schools, the Judy Center of Baltimore County or Baltimore County Head Start.

*No Class Cost – Grant Funded. Student book and workbook are not included.

Students must have unlimited internet access, a computer or tablet with camera and microphone or smart phone.

Online ZOOM classes

On the last day of class, you will need to attend one testing session on a CCBC campus.

Due to COVID19, placement testing and registrations are following the safety guidelines from the state and county. **You must wear a mask at all times during the registration process.**

How to register:

- To register for any Family Literacy ESOL class, go to any of the locations listed.
- Registrations are in person only. No phone or mail-in registration.
- Arrive on Time. Registration is on a first come-first served basis and will take 2 to 3 hours.
- Students must be at least 18 years of age and officially withdrawn from high school to enroll.
- To request an accommodation for a disability, please call 443-840-3428. Please allow staff adequate time to arrange it before registration.
- Students with an F-1 or J-1 visa are not eligible for these grant funded* classes.
- All students MUST take a test.
- For safety, space in the room is limited. You need to social distance while waiting to register.
- You MUST wear a mask at all times during the registration process.
- Only registering students are allowed inside the registration room. No family members or friends are allowed in the registration room.

Only Registering Students Allowed Inside.

Classes are held two times per week, Tuesday and Thursday, April 6th through June 10th. There are 19 online ZOOM classes and one in-person testing session on the last day of class on a CCBC campus. Complete schedules will be provided at registration.
